Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
September 11th

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue the theme of “*Discipleship*,” for this portion of the Ordinary Season of the Church Year, Holy Mother Church gives us the very famous parable of “*The Prodigal Son*.” We last heard this parable this past fourth Sunday of Lent. The word *prodigal* means wasteful. Who was exactly wasteful in this parable told by Jesus. Remember, a parable, is a story told so as to teach a lesson, using everyday examples, but with a shocking twist at the end. The younger son, the prodigal, was indeed wasteful. He took advantage of his father’s love for him and did not appreciate that everything his father had was his as well. But he wanted it for himself, to do what he wanted, for himself. So, he asks for his share of the inheritance. An inheritance is only given after your parents are dead. So, this is to say that to the son, it didn’t matter if his father was dead or alive. This son was indeed wasteful as he quickly missed spent everything he received from his father. The older Son, the one who seemingly appears to be the faithful son, also, was wasteful. He did not appreciate what he had with his father. He saw his relationship with his father, not as a son, but as a hired worker. He didn’t see what he had as his own, but exclusively belonging only to his father. He complained and did not rejoice in what his father shared with him everyday. The older son also resented his younger brother. The older brother thought, with the younger brother out of the picture, he would stand to inherit double now. The father was also wasteful. This parable is also known by many as the “*Parable of the Merciful Father*.” How was the father wasteful?

The father was overly generous to his sons and the hired servants. To the world, the younger son should have been disowned for even considering asking for his inheritance while his father was still alive. He allowed his two sons to enjoy all that was his even though they were both ungrateful and selfish. The father was always on the look- out for his youngest son and never neglected his older son in the midst of all this. When the younger son finally returned home the father restored his inheritance and when the older son was angered by this, the father still pleaded with him to share is everything that was his. And, the hired servants, they also shared in everything that was their master’s, and they were able to witness his love, mercy and generosity he should to his sons. Brothers and sisters, this is the story of the human family, this is our story. It is given to us to see how much God loves us. How could we ever not rejoice in it.

Vigésimo Cuarto Domingo Del Tiempo
Ordinario Septiembre 11

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

A medida que continuamos con el tema de “Discipulado,” para esta porción del Tiempo Ordinario del Año de la Iglesia, la Santa Madre Iglesia nos regala la muy famosa parábola del “Hijo Prodigio.” La última vez que escuchamos esta parábola fue el pasado cuarto domingo de Cuaresma. La palabra pródigo significa derrochador. ¿Quién fue exactamente derrochador en esta parábola contada por Jesús? Recuerde, una parábola, es una historia contada para enseñar una lección, usando ejemplos cotidianos del diario vivir, pero con un giro impactante al final. El hijo menor, el prodigo, de hecho fue un desperdicio. Se aprovechó del amor de su padre por él y no apreció que todo lo que su padre tenía también era suyo. Pero lo quería para sí mismo. para hacer lo que él quería, para si mismo. Así que, pide su parte de la herencia. Una herencia solo se da después de que sus padres están muertos. Así que, esto quiere decir que al hijo, no importaba si su padre estaba vivo o muerto. Este hijo fue realmente derrochador, ya que rápidamente se perdió todo lo que recibió de su padre. El hijo mayor, el que aparentemente parece ser el hijo fiel, también fue un desperdicio.

No apreciaba lo que tenía con su padre. Vio su relación con su padre, no como hijo, sino como trabajador contratado. No veía lo que tenía como propio, pero exclusivamente perteneciente a su padre. Se quejaba y no se regocijaba en lo que su padre compartía con él todos los días. El hijo mayor también resentía a su hermano menor. El hermano mayor pensó, con el hermano menor fuera de escena, ahora heredaría el doble. El padre también era derrochador. Esta parábola también es conocida por muchos como la “Parábola del Padre Misericordioso.” ¿Cómo fue derrochador el padre? El padre era demasiado generoso con sus hijos y los sirvientes contratados. Al mundo, el hijo menor debería haber sido repudiado por incluso considerar pedir su herencia mientras su padre todavía estaba vivo. Permitted que sus dos hijos disfrutaran de todo lo que era suyo a pesar de que ambos eran ingratos y egoístas. El padre siempre estuvo atento a su hijo menor y nunca descuidó a su hijo mayor en medio de todo esto. Cuando el hijo menor finalmente regresó a casa, el padre restauró su herencia y cuando el hijo mayor se enojó por esto, el padre todavía le suplicaba que compartiera todo lo que era suyo. los sirvientes contratados, también compartieron todo lo que era de su maestro, y pudieron ser testigos de su amor, misericordia, y generosidad que debía a sus hijos. Hermanos y hermanas, esta es la historia de la familia humana, esta es nuestra historia. Se nos da para ver cuánto nos ama Dios. ¿Cómo podríamos no regocijarnos en ello?

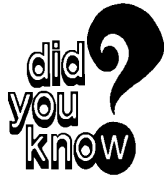
NUEVA GUIA PARA INTENCIONES DE MISA.

How to respond to choking, part one

In a choking emergency, it is important to respond quickly and effectively. Experts suggest reviewing maneuvers regularly so that you are equipped to respond to such an emergency. For children over the age of one, if a child is coughing, encourage him to keep coughing — this could be the quickest way to clear the airway. If a child is having trouble coughing, talking, or breathing, provide immediate help. You can attempt the Heimlich maneuver to dislodge the object and clear the airway. En una emergencia por atragantamiento, es importante responder rápida y eficazmente. Los expertos sugieren revisar los primeros auxilios para asfixia periódicamente para estar preparado para responder a una emergencia de este tipo. Para los niños mayores de un año, si un niño está tosiendo, anímelo a seguir tosiendo; esta podría ser la forma más rápida de despejar las vías respiratorias. Si un niño tiene problemas para toser, hablar o respirar, proporcione ayuda inmediata. Puede intentar la maniobra de Heimlich para ayudarlo a expulsar el objeto y despejar las vías respiratorias. 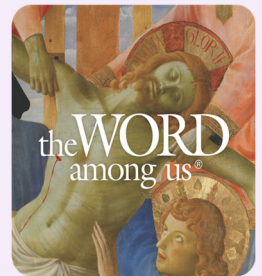

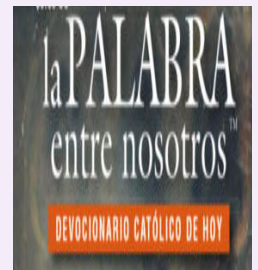
