Dear Brothers and Sisters,
Happy Easter! Jesus is Risen! Alleluia! Such good news! After the long season of Lent and the celebrations of Holy Week, we begin the Easter Season. Easter Sunday, the celebration of the day the Lord Jesus conquered sin and death by rising from the tomb, is filled with so much mystery that it cannot be contained into one day. Beginning today, Easter Sunday, we celebrate the *Octave of Easter*. This is an eight-day celebration of Easter Sunday. Each of the eight days are celebrated as if it were the very day of resurrection and the Gospel accounts will be of the day Jesus rose from the dead. The *Octave* ends next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, as Jesus appears to the apostles and breaths on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." For fifty days we will celebrate the Easter Season and the fullness of the Sacramental Life of the Church that was born from the side of Christ on Good Friday. As blood and water came from the side of Christ, our sharing in the divine life of Jesus began. Although we are now able to celebrate the Mass and the sacraments without restrictions Mass, there are still some who stay confined to their homes today. Many, courageously, have returned to normalcy. We are brought back to the humble beginnings of the Church, when they gathered in their homes. It is in the home (domestic church), where the first believers gathered to proclaim the scriptures and break the bread. There was no church buildings yet, and to be a Christian was out-lawed. So, today let us truly make it a celebration of the Lord's victory over sin and death. Participate in Mass, reflect with your family about the resurrection from the Gospel of John; have a discussion about it. Have a family meal rejoicing that Christ is our hope that death will not hold us. Now that we have gathered back in the church we have celebrated without restrictions four sessions of First Confessions, we have celebrated with four of our fellow parishioner, full initiation just last night at the Easter Vigil, we anticipate First Holy Communion, Confirmations, Weddings. This is indeed a life-filled and joyous season of the resurrection of Jesus. In my heart I long to be with all of you and celebrate our life of faith. Meanwhile, let us keep our faith alive in our homes and in our hearts. As the Church celebrates the Sacramental life, daily and every Sunday, our first reading will be taken from the Acts of the Apostles. This New Testament book gives us the accounts of what happened after the resurrection of our Lord, as the Apostles learned what it meant to be sent, as the Son was sent by the Father. As Jesus sent them the Holy Spirit, they became bold witnesses of all that they had seen and heard from Jesus. This is our story of how the Church began and spread throughout the world. As many have been received into the Church and have begun to live a sacramental life, they have become members of the Body of Christ – the Church. Just as we hear of the Church forming and its membership increasing and spreading, so too, the story is told by Saint Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. When Jesus gave the keys of the Kingdom to Peter, he was to give shape to the Bride of Christ, to bind and to loose. The Church begins to realize her role in the salvation that Jesus has won for us. Let us rejoice as we renew our Baptismal call as members of the Church, the Bride of Christ.

Domingo De Pascua
Abril 17

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanos,
Feliz Pascua! Jesús Resucitado! Aleluya! Tan buena noticia!
Después de la larga temporada de Cuaresma y las celebraciones de la Semana Santa, comenzamos el tiempo de Pascua. Domingo de Resurrección, la celebración del día en que el Señor Jesús conquistó el pecado y la muerte al levantarse de la tumba, está lleno de tanto misterio que no se puede contener en un día. A partir de hoy, Domingo de Resurrección, celebramos la Octava de Pascua. Esta es una celebración de ocho días del Domingo de Pascua. Cada uno de los ocho días se celebra como si fuera el mismo día de la resurrección y los relatos evangélicos serán del día en que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos. La Octava finaliza el próximo domingo, Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, "Recibe el Espíritu Santo." Durante cincuenta días celebraremos el Tiempo de Pascua y la plenitud de la Vida Sacramental de la Iglesia que nació del lado de Cristo el Viernes Santo. Como la sangre y el agua vinieron del costado de Cristo, nuestra participación en la vida divina de Jesús comenzó. Aunque ahora podemos celebrar la Misa y los sacramentos sin restricciones de Misa, todavía hay algunos que permanecen confinados en sus hogares hoy en día. Muchos valientemente, han vuelto a la normalidad. Somos traídos de vuelta a los humildes comienzos de la Iglesia, cuando se reunían en sus casas. Es en el hogar. (la iglesia domestica), donde los primeros creyentes se reunieron para proclamar las Escrituras y partir el pan. Todavía no había edificios de iglesias y ser cristiano estaba fuera de lo permitido. Así que, hoy hagamos verdaderamente una celebración de la victoria del Señor sobre el pecado y la muerte. Participa en misa, reflexiona con tu familia sobre la resurrección del Evangelio de Juan; tener una discusión al respecto. Tengan una comida familiar regocijándose de que Cristo es nuestra esperanza de que la muerte no nos detenga. Ahora que nos hemos reunido de nuevo en la iglesia, hemos celebrado sin restricciones cuatro sesiones de las Primeras Confesiones, hemos celebrado con cuatro de nuestros compañeros feligreses, iniciación completa anoche en la Vigilia Pascual, anticipamos las Primeras Comuniones, Confirmaciones, Bodas. Esta es, de hecho, una temporada llena de vida y gozosa de la resurrección de Jesús. En mi corazón anhelo estar con todos ustedes y celebrar nuestra vida de fe. Mientras tanto, mantengamos viva nuestra fe en nuestros hogares y en nuestros corazones. Mientras la Iglesia celebra la vida sacramental, todos los días y todos los domingos, nuestra primera lectura será tomada de los Hechos de los Apóstoles. Este libro del Nuevo Testamento nos da los relatos de lo que sucedió después de la resurrección de nuestro Señor, como los Apóstoles aprendieron lo que significaba ser enviado, como el Hijo fue enviado por el Padre. Como Jesús les envió el Espíritu Santo, se convirtieron en testigos audaces de todo lo que habían visto y oído de Jesús. Esta es nuestra historia de cómo la Iglesia comenzó y se extendió por todo el mundo. Muchos han sido recibidos en la Iglesia y han comenzado a vivir una vida sacramental, se han convertido en miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo- la Iglesia. Así como oímos hablar de la formación de la Iglesia y de su membresía que aumenta y se extiende, así también, la historia es contada por San Lucas en los Hechos de los Apóstoles. Cuando Jesús le dio las llaves del Reino a Pedro, debía dar forma a la Esposa de Cristo, para atar y aflojar. La Iglesia comienza a darse cuenta de su papel en la salvación que Jesús ha ganado para nosotros. Regocijémonos al renovar nuestro llamado bautismal como miembros de la Iglesia, la Esposa de Cristo.
