Second Sunday of Advent
December 5TH

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Advent Season is already upon us. We have lit the second purple Candle of the Wreath. It seems that time has accelerated as today we already hear of the voice that cries out in the desert, "prepare the way of the Lord." In today's Gospel that voice is John the Baptist. "John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. John the Baptist is the most immediate voice that announces the coming of Jesus. His mother Elizabeth says to the Blessed Mother Mary, "At the sound of your voice the leapt in my womb." But this week we encounter another that prepares the way and brings Jesus to us even before we hear John's voice.

This Wednesday, December 8th, we celebrate the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary was prepared from before her birth to be the spotless virgin that would be disposed to say "yes" to God's will. Even before the birth of Jesus, and before His crucifixion, Mary was already made pure, as God prepared a mother for himself. Mary was what we were to be - pure and immaculate - unstained of the original sin. As Mary was pregnant with Jesus when she visited her cousin Elizabeth, she was able to bring the Lord Jesus with her to a people waiting for redemption. John the Baptist leapt for joy in the womb of his mother, Elizabeth. John, as the voice, announces the Lord's arrival to his mother which moves her to declare Mary as the "Mother of my Lord." Next Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent takes precedence over the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mary, nonetheless, is a predominant figure within this season of Advent. Once again, Mary brings Jesus to a people waiting for redemption. In 1531 Mary was sent by God to Mexico. Mary appeared pregnant with Jesus to Juan Diego.

Juan Diego was the John the Baptist of his day, as he was sent to announce the Virgin's appearance and deliver her message to the bishop. To a still very pagan land, Mary proceeds in hast to the hill of Tepeyac to bring Jesus to us once again. Upon Mary's visit to Mexico more than 10 million people converted to the Catholic faith. Mary is declared as Patroness of the Americas. Still today many go on pilgrimage to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe to see the image of herself that she left on Juan Diego's tilma. We have a beautiful picture of our Mother Mary. We have a replica of this image in our church. Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe, continues to bring us to her Son. Mary with child is the beautiful image of this season of Advent. As Jesus dwelt for 9 months in Mary's womb, growing and waiting to live among us, so to, we desire for Jesus to live within our hearts today. With the help of Mary, may Jesus grow within each of us. May we, like Mary, John the Baptist, Elizabeth and Juan Diego, embrace the announcement of Jesus' coming and may we bring this good news to all we meet. Let us prepare, let us wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Segundo Domingo de Adviento,
Diciembre 5

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

El tiempo de Adviento ya está sobre nosotros. Hemos encendido la segunda vela morada de la corona. Parece que el tiempo se ha acelerado como hoy ya escuchamos de la voz que clama en el desierto. "preparad el camino del Señor." En el Evangelio de hoy, esa voz es Juan el Bautista. "Juan recorrió toda la región del Jordán, proclamando un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados. Juan el Bautista es la voz más inmediata que anuncia la venida de Jesús. Su madre Isabel dice a la Santísima Madre María, "Al sonido de tu voz, el salto en mi vientre. Pero esta semana nos encontramos con otro que prepara el camino y nos trae a Jesús incluso antes de que escuchemos la voz de Juan. Este miércoles, 8 de Diciembre, celebramos la Inmaculada Concepción de la Santísima Virgen María.

María fue preparada desde antes de su nacimiento para ser la virgen sin mancha que estaría dispuesta a decir, "Sí" a la voluntad de Dios. Incluso antes del nacimiento de Jesús y antes de su crucifixión, María ya fue hecha pura, como Dios preparó a una madre para sí mismo. María era lo que debíamos ser, pura e inmaculada, sin mancha del pecado original. Como María estaba embarazada de Jesús cuando visitó a su prima Isabel, ella fue capaz de llevar al Señor Jesús con ella a un pueblo que esperaba la redención. Juan el Bautista saltó de alegría en el vientre de su madre, Isabel. Juan como la voz, anuncia la llegada del Señor a su madre, lo que la mueve a declarar a María como la "Madre de mi Señor." El próximo domingo, el tercer domingo de Adviento tiene prioridad sobre la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. María, no obstante, es una figura predominante dentro de esta temporada de Adviento. Otra vez, María lleva a Jesús a un pueblo que espera la redención. En 1531 María fue enviada por Dios a México. María se apareció embarazada de Jesús a Juan Diego. Juan Diego fue el Juan Bautista de su época, ya que fue enviado para anunciar la aparición de la Virgen y entregar su mensaje al obispo. A una tierra todavía muy pagana, María se apresura al cerro del Tepeyac para traernos a Jesús una vez más. Tras la visita de María a México, más de 10 millones de personas se convirtieron a la fe católica. María es declarada Patrona de las Américas. Todavía hoy muchos van en peregrinación a la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe para ver la imagen de sí misma que dejó en la tilma de Juan Diego. Tenemos una hermosa imagen de nuestra Madre María. Tenemos una réplica de esta imagen en nuestra iglesia. María, Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, continúa llevándonos a su Hijo. María con el niño es la hermosa imagen de este tiempo de Adviento. Como Jesús habitó durante 9 meses en el vientre de María, creciendo y esperando vivir entre nosotros, que, deseamos que Jesús viva dentro de nuestros corazones hoy. Con la ayuda de María, que Jesús crezca dentro de cada uno de nosotros. Que nosotros, como María, Juan Bautista, Isabel y Juan Diego, abrasemos el anuncio de la venida de Jesús y que podamos llevar estas buenas nuevas a todos los que encontrremos. estemos preparados, esperemos con gozosa esperanza la venida de nuestro Salvador Jesucristo.

LAS MAÑANITAS A LA VIRGEN DE GUADALUPE SATURDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2021

You and your family are invited to a celebration in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe at the Cathedral of the Our Lady of the Angels (555 W. Temple Street, Los Angeles, 90012) on Wednesday, December 11 at 6 p.m.

The annual celebration on December 11 will begin at 6 p.m. with indigenous dancers on the Cathedral Plaza and the veneration of the relic of the *tilma* of St. Juan Diego, on which the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared 490 years ago. The Cathedral is home to the only relic of the *tilma* outside of the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City.

At 10 p.m., the celebration continues inside the Cathedral with a special Rosary, followed by a performance by Mariachi Lindas Mexicanas. The musical tribute, or serenata, begins at 11 p.m., with guest singers invited to serenade the Virgin and sing "Las Mañanitas," a traditional Mexican birthday song to honor the Virgin on her Feast Day. The program will be in Spanish and the festivities will culminate with midnight Mass celebrated by Archbishop José H. Gomez.






